

How to turn translation on or off (in Chrome)

First, enable Google Chrome, click the menu icon, and then click "Settings". You can also type `chrome://settings/` in the address bar to go there directly.

In the settings menu, scroll down and click "Advanced".

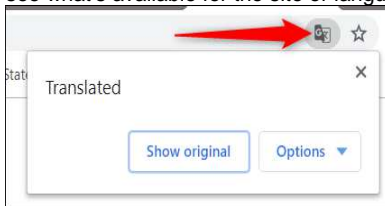
Scroll down a little further until you see the Languages heading, then click Language.



Chrome has translation enabled by default. If you want to disable this feature, click the toggle button in the off position. If you want to keep using the translate feature, do nothing.

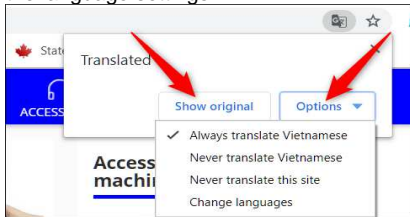


When you browse a website that's automatically translated by Chrome, you'll see a Google Translate icon in the omnibox. To see what's available for the site or language-specific options, click the Translate icon and choose the language.



Last steps in Google Chrome

From there you can translate the page to the original language or you can click the Options dropdown button for other options such as: B. Always translate language, Never translate language, or Never translate the current website. You can also change the language settings.



If you have more than one language added to your browser, Chrome usually only offers to translate webpages into the browser's main language. By default, the translation of added additional languages is disabled in Chrome.

However, if you prefer Chrome to support these languages as well, click More (three dots next to a language) next to the language and check the option "Offer to translate pages into this language". This allows Chrome to translate certain languages for you in the future.
